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Makkovik

Makkovik has a population nearing 400. Its citizens are mainly **Settlers**, meaning they have ancestry that is a mixture of European and Inuit.



History

The community of Makkovik was founded in 1859 by a Norwegian named Torsten Kverna Andersen and his wife, Mary Ann Thomas. Torsten came to Labrador as an employee of the Hudson's Bay Company. Mary Ann was from Makkovik Bay.

The name Makkovik comes from two Inuktitut words. Vik means 'place' and Makko is most likely a corruption of maggok, meaning 'two'.

Hebron End

This area, in 1959, became the home of resettled families from Hebron, an old Moravian Mission Community about 250 miles north of Makkovik. Few of these resettled families chose to remain in Makkovik permanently.
